# **Associate Chaplain's Message**

Well here we are again in the season of Advent and Christmas. The stores are decorated and we begin to plan how we will decorate our homes and places of business. There's the anticipation of waiting for the festive holidays to begin, where old friends are contacted once again and memories of the past linger in our minds. It's a time of waiting and getting ready. The question is, what are we getting ready for? Is it the sound of Seasons Greetings that we hear at this time? Is it the ringing of bells at many store entrances, where we feel that tug in our hearts to reach out and give to those who have less or even nothing? What is it that we are waiting for?

I hope that we don't lose our focus on what this season is all about. At Mass listen to the Advent Sunday readings for the scriptural description that we should be focusing on. It begins with the end of Matthew's gospel with Jesus telling his disciples to stay awake and be ready for the coming of the Son of Man. Then we go to the beginning of Matthew's gospel with John the Baptist preparing the way. It continues on and ends with the last Sunday of Advent describing the birth of Jesus.

We as Christians should be living out our lives preparing ourselves for the second coming of Christ. We call this the Parousia. It is the Greek word for coming, or advent or arrival. It originally described the arrival of a king or high government official for an inspection of a village. But the early Christians used the word to describe the role that they envisioned for the risen Jesus at the Last Judgment and the events that surrounded it. For Paul and the early Christians, the second coming was a certainty. But since no one knows the exact time, our focus is on being prepared for it always. In this world of today with all of its problems, persecution, evil, and immorality, Christ is calling us to persevere in our faith.

The efforts that every one of us has to make, to make this world a better place to live in, are important, but their results won't compare with the transformation that Christ will bring when He returns. I know that most every day we pray for God's Kingdom to come - thy will be done here on earth - but how many of us are willing to let go of our own kingdom? Let's face it, we've worked hard to establish our own little private kingdom here on earth, and we want to protect and defend it. The Lord isn't asking us to give up everything and isolate ourselves from the world, but only to think about our choices today so that tomorrow we will be open to something that He might have in mind for us.

It would be nice if we could have a world where people find it easy to do good, but it seems that our world moves more and more in the opposite direction. It may be an impossible task to change the direction that this world is moving in but it is possible to change the direction that each individual is taking.
