The accident was in the morning paper and on the local news. A tractor trailer side-swiped a car on a busy road in the early hours of the morning. The driver of the car, a 38 year old man, was killed instantly. He had been heading home to his wife and three children after a day-long business meeting. The driver of the car was a member of the Knights of Columbus and, more importantly, an insured member.

When the agent visited with "Joe" and his wife in their home, trying to determine what kind of insurance solution would be right for Joe and his family, there were of course many interruptions from his young family. Because of his Knights of Columbus insurance policy, "Joe's" family would be properly cared for. The bills would be paid and their dreams of higher education for the kids would still come true.

Joe truly believed in the first principle of our Order – Charity. There is no greater charity that we, as Brother Knights, can provide than the care of our spouse and children. Deacon's Report

This month we will take a look at the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Through this sacrament a bishop ordains or sets aside certain men to function as bishops, priests and deacons. This ordination provides an important element needed for the continuation of the Church in the modern world. When we look at the gospels we see that there isn't any clearly defined ceremony of ordination for the apostles. In fact, the word priest was not applied to the leaders of the new Church for the first hundred years after Christ. But we know that there is no doubt that the apostles served the church as the first priests and bishops. They were selected to continue the work of Christ after Jesus ascended into heaven and gave these men the power of the Holy Spirit to continue the work started by Jesus. In the early Church it was very clear that all baptized believers shared the priesthood of Christ. The Holy Spirit gave many special gifts at the first Pentecost. Those early Christians recognized and made use of the different charisms that helped build up the church. Leaders were soon chosen to preach and teach and their office was signified by the laying on of hands and calling down the Holy Spirit. These were the ordained leaders that had the power to preach and to lead in the Eucharist and to guide the community. As the Church continued to expand the role of the ordained priest became very important. As the priesthood grew, the role of the laity decreased and the lay people did less and less until only those called to religious life were involved in church ministry.

Before the Second Vatican Council men were called into the service for God by becoming transitional deacons and then after their studies were completed they were ordained into the priesthood. After Vatican II the Church restored the tradition of permanent deacons who were usually married men. These men promised to serve, in a unique and committed way, the Church in the many different ministries. Deacons, permanent and transitional, today assist the priest or bishop at the altar.

They baptize, witness marriages, conduct funerals, preach, teach and care for the poor, the sick and those that are hurting. The priest in addition to his role as teacher and leader, is the presider over worship services. He is the celebrant of the Mass, and grants absolution in the sacrament of penance, and anoints the sick and dying. I hope that each of us will daily lift up our prayers to the calling of more young men into the priesthood to serve the Church and all the people of God.
